

Lighting Show 2008

tp24 are pleased to be exhibiting again at The Lighting Show 2008. After the successful launch of the tube and micro lamps at last year's show tp24 have had another exciting year.

The Cambridgeshire based company was pleased to supply the lighting for a challenge taken up by celebrity, Tommy Walsh, which was to build an eco-friendly house in 60 days for just 60k for the Discovery Real Time Channel. Tommy's interior designer, Victoria Stanton, was both surprised and delighted by the product range of dedicated low energy lighting available from tp24.

2007 has seen two major builders, McCarthy and Stone and Crest Homes, sign up to not only 30% dedicated low energy lighting, as required by the building regulations, but to 100% and 75% respectively. Both companies were impressed by the LI dedicated system, produced by tp24, and are themselves dedicated to reducing their carbon footprint.

Managing Director, Shaun Davis, has taken the company to new heights by entering the "Running The Gauntlet" competition run by the East of England Development Agency (EEDA). Out of hundreds of applicants tp24 were short listed to the final 10 and were praised for their dedication and commitment to ensuring a greener future and answering the needs of the new build industry with regards to lighting.

Kyoto Jazz and Grandē are two new ranges to be launched at this year's show. Jazz is a collection of bold designer fittings suitable for contemporary interiors in both domestic and commercial settings. Grandē offers a range of fittings primarily for the hotel contract market. This collection of large statement pieces has the added benefit of switchable lights, enabling the user to reduce the light output when needed, for example, in corridors and communal areas during the night.

tp24 have opened up endless possibilities for all manufacturers with their licensing agreements for LI components which are readily available both in the UK and in China. tp24

believes passionately in reducing energy consumption throughout the world and are excited by the prospect of working with other lighting manufacturers to this end.

tp24 are committed to the research and development of low energy lighting. Even with renewable resources the only way to cut carbon emissions is to reduce energy consumption. Using a dedicated system is the only way you can guarantee no switchback to non energy saving lamps. The EU policy is to reduce all 40 watt lamps to a minimum output of 14 lumens per watt by 2017 – this is not enough - ours are already over 40 l/watt.
